Critics Have Missed The Best Reason For Church Discipline

Jesus Told Us

To Do IT.

Among Those Familiar With Church Discipline

Some view it as a license to get:

- Revenge
- Hurt
- Obtain justice
- Bring resolution to a hurt heart

Three Reasons To Not Confront Those Who Offend Us Personally

- 1. Scripture does not support the idea of confronting our offenders.
- 2. Scripture tells us to independently and unconditionally forgive our offenders.
- 3. Scripture has many examples of this principle.

Conclusion From Last Study - Principle #1

When the offense is

against us personally,

we are to forgive

independently and unconditionally.

... not to confront

When Do We Implement Church Discipline? - Principle #2 -

When a brother's sin is habitual.
