Why Did Paul Write Boldly?

Romans 15:15 - 16

v. 16 - Because he was a servant of Christ:

- ***Result of grace given***
- ***Like a priest***
- ***Message is the gospel of God***

For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. After that He appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time, most of whom remain until now, but some have fallen asleep; then He appeared to James, then to all the apostles . . .

1 Cor. 15:3-7

For by grace you have been saved through faith; and that not of yourselves, it is the gift of God; not as a result of works, so that no one may boast.

Why Did Paul Write Boldly?

Romans 15:15 - 16

v. 16 - *Because he was a servant of Christ:*

- ***Result of grace given***
- ***Became a priest***
- ***Message was the gospel of God***
- ***Preach to the Gentiles***

The Result of Paul's Preaching

Romans 15:17 - 19

v. 17 - Christ produced the result

v. 18 - Gentiles became obedient

v. 19 - Because they responded to the Holy Spirit
