

- v. 3 Called the burnt offering
- v. 3-4 The offering was to be the best
 - Offered at the door to be accepted
- v. 5 Seven more holy convocations
- v. 6-9 Pleasing aroma

v. 10-13 - Option 2 . . . Sheep/Goat

- Two times per day Num. 28:3-8
 - 3rd hour (9:00 am)
 - 9th hours (3:00 p.m.)
- Twice on Sabbath days Num. 28:9-10
- During most festivals Num. 28:11-29:40

Meal Offering - 1

Leviticus 2:1 - 16

- v. 1 Called the grain offering
 - Symbolized worship & thanksgiving
 - Ingredients were from the field
- v. 2
- Worship took a handful of everything
- v. 3
- Rest was given to the priest to eat

Meal Offering - 2

Leviticus 2:1 - 16

- v. 4 10 Different types of grain offerings
- v. 11 No leaven or honey
- v. 12-16 Fruit or product from the field
- v. 13 Must have salt
