4	Tyre is a ship.	Builders created a perfectly beautiful ship.
5	Planks from fir.	Masts from Lebanon.
6	Oars made of oak from Bashan.	Deck inlaid with ivory from Cyprus.
7	Sails made of fine Egyptian embroidered linen.	Awning was blue and purple from Elishah.
8	Rowers were from Sidon and Arvad.	Pilots are from Tyre.
9	Seams repaired by elders from Gebal and Tyre.	Sailors are from Tyre.
10	Shields and helmets were from Persia, Lud, and Put.	_____
11	Army was from Arvad and Gammadin.	_____

12	Tarshish	Spain (?)	Silver, iron, tin, and lead.
13	Javan	Iona, large area of Greece	Slaves, vessels of bronze.
13	Tubal	Eastern Asia Minor	Slaves, vessels of bronze.
13	Meshech	Central Asia Minor	Slaves, vessels of bronze.
14	Beth-togarmah	Armenia, Asia Minor	Horses, War horses, mules.
15	Rhodes ¹	Modern Rhodes	Ivory tusks and ebony.
16	Aram	Jordan	Emeralds, purple, Embroidery, fine linen, coral, rubies.
17	Judah and Israel	Palestine	Wheat of Minnith, cakes, honey, oil and balm.
18	Damascus	Syria	Wine of Helbon, white wool.
19	Vedan, Javan, and Uzal ²	Aden (?)	Wrought iron, cassia, sweet cane.
20	Dedan	Arabia	Saddlecloths for riding.
21	Kedar	Arabia	Lambs, rams, goats.
22	Sheba and Raamah	Arabia	Spices, precious stones, gold.
23-25	Haran, Canneh, Eden, Sheba, Asshur and Chilmad	Mesopotamia	Choice garments, clothes of blue, embroidered work, carpets of many colors and tightly wound cords.
